Dr Kulshreshtha spoke about the relevance of celebrating Gandhiji's 150th birthday, in our lives today. He also added that Gandhiji's principles of ahimsa and patience helps to unite the people of our country. Floral tributes were paid by the dignitaries to Gandhiji. To honor Gandhiji, 2 of his most popular songs, namely "Raghupathi Raghava Raja Ram" and "Vaishno janatha" were played to the audience. "Vaishno Janatha", sung by famous personalities from all across the globe was screened and this further portrayed the impact that Gandhiji and his principles of ahimsa, had on the people of India and abroad.
