The Dean presided over the meeting. At the outset he welcomed all the members and informed them about the anti ragging measures being taken by our institution to monitor a strict vigilant to curb such menace. The Dean has informed all the members to implement the guidelines as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, UGC and Medical Council of India.

The following issues were discussed:

- A. Members were requested to ensure the prevention of ragging in and around the campus. If any unevent incidents happen, the members should bring the fact to the notice of the Dean, CHRI,immediately.
- B. To make aware of the students of dehumanizing effect of ragging inherent in its perversity.
- C. To keep a continuous watch and vigil over ragging so as to prevent its occurrence.
- D. To organize meeting with students to advise them to regulate their own movements and interactions, specially strangers or undesirable characters.
- E. Coordinator may conduct meeting frequently and discuss day to day situation in the campus and Inform to the higher authorities.
- F. Every year, before commencement of the classes with fresher's in various disciplines, an orientation programme will be organized, where first year students will participate along with their senior students. The Dean, faculty of various departments, the warden and the administrators may address the students and stress the importance of maintaining the campus Ragging free.
- G. The students should be apprised of the fact that ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and they should refrain from any ragging activities.
- H. The students should be emphasized in the orientation classes that those who involves in ragging in any form will be suspended immediately from the college and Hostel and they are liable for punishments as decided by the Anti Ragging Committee.

With the above deliberation the meeting was concluded.
