- Mahila-E-Haat is a bilingual online marketing platform that leverages technology to help aspiring women entrepreneurs, self-help groups, and NGOs showcase their products and services.
- Mahila Shakti Kendra aims to empower rural women with opportunities for skill development, employment, digital literacy, health, and nutrition.
- Support to Training and Employment Programme for Women (STEP) The STEP scheme provides women with skills to take up gainful employment.
- Working Women Hostel Scheme aims to ensure safe, convenient accommodation for working families, along with day-care facilities for their children, wherever possible in urban, semi-urban and rural areas.

Also falling in march is the World No Smoking Day. This day's primary purpose is to spread awareness about tobacco consumption's harmful health effects through the cigarette and other modes. BEAT THE BLUES - A brief overview of depression

Depression is the most widely discussed psychiatric illness in the world. It is also one of the most common psychiatric conditions, with the World Health Organisation estimates about 350 million people of all ages suffering from it globally. Common symptoms include lowness of mood, reduction of interests in all spheres, easy fatigability, and feeling of low energy, lack of concentration and memory, feeling that one is worthless, that one's life is in a hopeless situation, feelings that it would be better to die or having thoughts of killing oneself, difficulty in getting sleep, lack of hunger, and poor self-confidence. Everyone goes through situations in which we would feel that we have one or the other symptoms listed above. But that doesn't mean that all of us are depressed. It is only when most of these symptoms occur together lasting for more than two weeks, at least it means that you are having depression. The reason why a person should have depression is not homogeneous. External stress, relationship issues, difficulty in adjusting to changed circumstances, any adverse life events, poor emotional reserve, low thyroid levels, vitamin D deficiency, long-standing physical illness can be a factor as to why depression occurs. There are a significant number of people who develop depression without any obvious stress or precipitating reason, which is known as endogenous depression. Depression is one of the leading causes of death because a significant group of people who are depressed kills themselves. Hence, it is of utmost importance that one should identify depression as early as possible and get it treated sooner.

It is always advised to people who get thoughts of killing themselves to avoid being alone, share their feelings with a person whom they identify as the one who is non-judgemental and empathizing, and to seek psychiatric help.

Chettinad Outreach Activities

Dr. MUTHULAKSHMI REDDY MATERNITY BENEFIT SCHEME




About the scheme

Dr. Muthulakshmi Reddy Maternity Benefit Scheme (MRMBS) was named after Dr. Muthulakshmi Reddy, Tamil Nadu's first woman doctor and a social activist. It was launched in 1987. Beneficiaries of this scheme are poor pregnant mothers. Pregnant women who are 19 years and old are eligible for this scheme for their first two pregnancies. Mothers delivered at Hospitals empanelled under Dr.MRMBS are also eligible for the provision of free delivery services including cesarean deliveries. Antenatal registration at or before 12 weeks receives an 1st installment of Rs.2000. On completion of three months, a kind benefit of Rs.2000 is rewarded. After four months Rs.2000 is given as the IInd installment amount. A nutrition kit worth Rs.2000 is given as a kind benefit thereafter. The nutrition kit contains Health Mix Powder for Pregnant Mother, IFA Syrup, Dates, Protein syrup, Aavin Ghee, T.Albendazole, and towel. After delivery, the third installment of sum Rs.4000 is rewarded. After completion of all 3 doses of OPV/Rota/Pentavalent and 2 doses of IPV, a sum of Rs.4000 is given as IVth installment. Vth installment of Rs.2000 is given after completion of Measles-Rubella vaccination between 9th and 12th month of their infants.

The scheme at our hospital

Our institute- Chettinad Hospital and Research Institute, was empanelled by the Government of Tamil Nadu under the scheme in January 2019. From its inception at our institute, there has been a steady increase in the number of women who benefitted from this scheme. Till now a total of 1454 pregnant women were benefitted under the scheme at our Hospital. All the services including delivery, medicines, consultation, and Caesarean section are done at free of cost





District Blindness Control Society A Collaborative Service of CHRI

The National Program for Control of Blindness has been launched by the Government of India in the year 1976. It is a 100% centrally sponsored scheme whose goal is to reduce the prevalence of blindness. Under this program, District Blindness Control Society is established with the primary purpose to plan, implement and monitor the blindness control activities comprehensively at the district level. Our institute Chettinad Hospital and Research Institute has got the opportunity to help people through this program since 2012. Under this program, weekly camps are being conducted in the rural areas of the Kancheepuram district. In these camps, Teamworking behind these camps are ophthalmologist, optometrist, and nursing staff to screen for refractive errors, cataracts, and other diseases. Screening programs to identify diabetic/hypertensive retinopathy, glaucoma, and squint are also carried out in these camps. Patients requiring cataract surgery are referred to CHRI and surgery is performed. The school health program is also carried out under this program for the benefit of school-going children to identify refractive errors, vitamin A deficiency, squint, and other ocular pathologies. Approximately 16000 patients have benefited from this DBCS scheme at our hospital during the past 5 years.

All the healthcare workers including doctors, nursing staff, and paramedical workers were inoculated with the Covishield vaccine.







Discussion on Rosai-Dorfman disease- A rare case presentation

A rare case discussion was held at the Department of Radiology on 02.02.2021. A patient presented to Imaging studies to the Department of Radiology, Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute. The incidence of the disease is 1 in 2,00000 mostly prevalent in the United States. A total of 650 cases have been reported since its first description in 1969. Rosai-Dorfman disease also known as Sinus histiocytosissis with massive lymphadenopathy is a rare non-neoplastic disease. It is a pseudolymphomatous benign disorder and patients usually present with fever, painless bilateral cervical lymphadenopathy, elevated ESR, leukocytosis with neutrophilia, and hypergammaglobulinemia. 49-year-old south Indian female was admitted to our Chettinad Academy of Research and Education with chief complaints of severe headache, nasal stuffiness, and painless cervical lymphadenopathy. 


Figure 3- Coronal T1 weighted image (Right cervical lymphnode)




Figure 4 - Coronal T1 MRI showing meningeal involvement

and ESR were elevated 15K/microl,6omg/L and 83mm/h respectively. Her serum uric acid level was also elevated. Because of headache with no history of trauma Magnetic resonance imaging (MRI)(GE 1.5T) with contrast was recommended for further evaluation.T2 hypointense homogenously enhancing lesion with sellar and suprasellar involvement measuring 20mm (CC)x 17 mm(TS) x 5mm (AP) noted causing indentation on optic chiasm which is pushed superiorly (figure 1) No significant expansion of sella. Enhancing T2 hypointensities were noted in bilateral cavernous sinus encasing internal carotid arteries which were contiguous with and inseparable from the lesion. Enlarged parapharyngeal and cervical nodes are noted in the visualized region. Nodular enhancement is noted in the paramedian aspect. Excisional biopsy of right cervical lymph node showed attenuated infiltration of lymphoplasmocytic cells and histiocytosis of varying sizes and foci of emperipolesis within the cellular borders of large, pale histiocytic cells. On immunohistochemistry, there was a diffuse expression of S-100 protein by larger histiocyte cells and all cells were negative for cytokeratin AE1/AE3 and CD1a. The diagnosis of Rosai-Dorfman disease(RDD) was given based on a pathology report.

Endobronchial Ultrasound – An overview

An E-guest lecture was conducted by the Department of Respiratory Medicine on the topic Endobronchial Ultrasound – An overview on 04.02.2021. The speaker of the event was Dr.V.R.Pattabiraman, Senior interventional pulmonologist and senior consultant in pulmonary critical care and sleep medicine at Royal Care Hospitals, Coimbatore. There were a total of 39 participants. The session was moderated by Professor and H.O.D Dr.Meenakshi.N, Department of Respiratory Medicine. The speaker talked about the use of endobronchial ultrasound in the diagnosis of different types of lung disorders, including inflammation, infections, or cancer.



CHETPATHCON - World Cancer Day

Department of Pathology, CHRI conducted CHETPATH-CON 2021 on World Cancer Day which falls on the 4th February of every year. The theme for this year is "I am and I will" and the theme for CME this year was "Cervical Cancer". Dr. Shirley Sundersingh, Head of the Oncopathology department in Adyar Cancer institute spoke on the topic " Carcinoma Cervix in Indian Perspective". She described the latest trends and incidence of cervical cancer in Indian women, highlighting the importance of









early screening and diagnosis for improving the overall survival in these patients. The second talk was given by Dr.RanojiVijaysing Shinde, Professor, Obstetrics and Gynaecology department, CHRI on "Carcinoma cervix - Clinical Aspects" wherein he described the etiopathogenesis and natural history of cervical cancer, the various surgical treatment options, and the importance of HPV vaccine. The CME was attended by faculties and Postgraduates in Lecture Hall - 1 of the college block. A collage competition was conducted to commemorate this day and the theme was "Cancer Awareness". The winners were Bhavadharshine(1st place) and Thanushree (2nd Place) of Dental college.

Cancer awareness program by the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology

World Cancer Day was commemorated by the department of Obstetrics & Gynecology, CHRI on 04.02.2021. An awareness drive was conducted, with the HOD, Associate Professor Dr. Renuka, and other faculty from the department talking to the public about cervical cancer and its prevention by Pap smear screening. Awareness about the need for self-breast examination was created with charts and video demonstrations. The women were also sensitized about endometrial cancer and its symptoms of post-menopausal bleeding. Most importantly the women were given diet counseling and






the need to avoid carcinogenic foods. It was a very interactive session with lots of questions from the women which were addressed.

The speaker gave a lecture on Hepatocellular carcinoma (HCC). Following are the excerpts from the lecture. HCC is the most common primary malignancy of the liver. Most people have an underlying liver disease such as Hepatitis B or C, alcohol-related liver disease, or non-alcoholic fatty liver disease. Newer diagnostic and treatment modalities have improved survival among patients with HCC. The program enabled young doctors including under-graduates and post-graduates to know more about the disease from a renowned doctor who has immense experience in handling HCC. The Awareness Program was lucid and informative and was well received by everyone who attended it.

International Street Children's Day



Dr.Preethi enlightened the audience on the various laws and prominent offences and crimes related to a female genital mutation that took place in our country. Finally, Dr.Nawaz Ahmed, Associate Professor, Department of Forensic Medicine gave a succinct account of the medico-legal aspects of sexual offences. The program was appreciated by the audience on a positive note and the need for education from childhood to prevent such brutality in our community was insisted. Dr. Shery acted as the moderator of the event.

This was followed by an interactive session with parents. The program ended with the distribution of free deworming medicines to all children between 1-18 years of age.





National Deworming Day - OBG

Department Of OBG, CHRI has commemorated National deworming day on 10.02.2021. This day is observed to reduce the morbidity due to soil-related helminthic infection among adults and children. The event conducted included health awareness talk to the patients at the OBG outpatient department and interactive sessions with the women. The awareness event started with an introductory talk by the Head of the Department Dr. Anuradha. Health awareness talk was given by Dr. Jennifer Britto, Assistant Professor. She discussed the burden of the disease, mode of infection, symptoms, and preventive measures with a display of charts. Subsequently, the effects of the disease on pregnant women were elaborated by Prof Dr. Vijayalakshmi. This was followed by an interactive session with the patients in which many queries of patients were addressed. Subsequently, a health talk was given to patients of CFCH, and patients' gueries were addressed. Dr. Jennifer addressed one of the gueries raised by the patient by explaining the importance of taking a deworming tablet during pregnancy in the second and third trimester.







National Deworming Day - General Surgery

National Deworming Day was observed by the Department of General Surgery, CHRI on 10.02.2021. A public awareness speech and interactive session were organized by the Department, CHRI. The postgraduates enacted a roleplay emphasizing the importance of deworming, to educate the patients. The program was attended by faculty, undergraduate and postgraduate students, patients, and children. An awareness program was organized at Rural Health Centre, Poonjeri at 11.00 a.m. Around 60 people attended the event and it was a grand success. Two guest lectures were organized online. 






Seminar on Endometriosis

A seminar was organized by the Department of Obstetrics &Gynecology, CHRI on 11.02.2021 via zoom platform (online). The moderator of the seminar was Dr.K. Vijayalakshmi, Professor, Department of Obstetrics & Gynecology. The speakers of the seminar were Dr.K.Vijayalakshmi, Dr.S.Nandhini, Dr.S.Geethalakshmi and Dr.Rizwana. The topics discussed were etiology, sites of endometriosis, types, classification and clinical presentation, investigations, management, and differential diagnosis. Recent advances in diagnosis and treatment were also discussed upon. The participants were the faculties and postgraduates from the departments of OBG & General surgery and undergraduate students. There were about 255 participants. It was followed by a case scenario-based discussion where many of the attendees interacted and discussed.

Workshop On Fissures And Foramina-Surgical Anatomy Of Orbit And Skull Base



He also told the researchers that they should come out of the impression that research grants are only for established researchers with high credentials. 
what changes could make their proposal better. He emphasized that the faculty must look at themselves as reviewers who have to go through several applications to select a few and that too from subjects that may not exactly fit their expertise. Prof. Murugesan's lecture, evaluations, and discussions were followed up by Dr.Pazhani GP who explained how a project proposal has to be submitted online. Through screenshots of the project grant calls, Dr.Pazhani took the audience through what they would encounter when they start filling up their proposals. Dr. Shoba explained what a project call would require. She emphasized that the entire requirements should be prepared upfront before starting the submission process online. All three speakers advised the faculty to avoid basic errors such as spelling, grammar, lengthy sentences, unconventional abbreviations, etc., besides erroneous totaling of budget. The workshop had a total of 33 participants and hands-on exercises were given and evaluation was done with inputs shared to the participants.

Neck Dissection And Management In Oral Cancers

A guest lecture on neck dissection and management in oral cancers was organized by the Department of ENT, CHRI on 24.02.2021. 

Interesting Radiology Case-Intracranial Vascular Malformations

An interesting case discussion was conducted by the Department of Radiology, CHRI on 24.02.2021. The speaker of the lecture was DR. J.Anandapadmanabhan MD, FRCR., Consultant Neuroradiologist, Swansea Bay University Health Board, Wales NHS, UK. He talked about the case of Intracranial Vascular Malformations. Intracranial vascular malformations encompass Arterio-venous malformations of the brain and dura, cavernous malformation (cavernoma), venous malformations (developmental venous anomalies), dural AV fistula, and capillary telangiectasias. Together, IVM is the most common cause of primary intracerebral hemorrhage in young adults. Aneurysms may coexist with other types of IVM, most often with brain AVM. The patient can





experience various symptoms and signs at presentation. The natural history of vascular malformations depends on lesion type, location, size, and overall hemodynamics. Digital subtraction angiography remains the gold standard, able to exquisitely delineate the location and number of feeding vessels and the pattern of drainage. On angiography, AVM appears as a tightly packed mass of enlarged feeding arteries that supply a central nidus. One or more dilated veins drain the nidus and abnormal opacification of veins occurs in the arterial phase represents shunting. Therefore we report the imaging features of intracranial vascular malformations to increase our awareness of its diagnosis and treatment. The lecture was attended by 100 participants from various colleges across the country.


CME - Physiology of Bone Healing

Introduction to NABH on Nursing Excellence


