LETTER FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

Regarding the COVID-19 vaccines, the states were assured that there is no shortfall of vaccines and stocks would continue to be supplied whenever necessary, and the public need not be worried. More vaccines would be supplied to the areas with low vaccine coverage and to the districts which report higher caseloads every day. India stands third in the total number of COVID-19 vaccine doses administered and second in the number of people fully vaccinated. (both1st and 2nd vaccine doses). There is also more good news as the oral vaccines for COVID-19 have shown promising results in animal studies and soon will be entering the human clinical trial phase -I. The oral vaccine-Orovax Medical is being developed by the collaboration of Oramed (an Israeli-American company) and Premas Biotech (India). It is believed that the oral vaccine could provide a better immunity against COVID-19 in the respiratory and gastroesophageal passages similar to oral polio vaccines against wild poliovirus. The upside of the vaccine is that the people can also take this at their homes and avoid crowded hospitals or clinics. The vaccine is yeast-based which makes the manufacturing cost cheaper.

Gouty Arthritis- A Practical Approach

What is Gout?

Gout is characterized by painful joint inflammation, most commonly in the first metatarsophalangeal joint, resulting from the precipitation of monosodium urate crystals in a joint space. When there is an increase in the uric acid level in the blood, there is a chance of crystallization of uric acid. Such crystals get deposited in joints which starts to show the symptoms of gout. The predominant reason for an increased level of blood urea is the reduced amount of excretion of



uric acid from the body. Synthesis of excessive amounts of uric acid may be another reason for increased levels in the blood, but the cases are more where the first reason is predominant.

What are the factors which increase the risk of Gout?

Genetic mutations may be associated with overproduction or underexcretion of uric acid because of defects in the renal urate transporter system. The prevalence of gout increases with age (peaks at more than 12% in persons older than 80 years). Female sex hormones increase urinary excretion of uric acid, pre-menopausal women have a substantially lower prevalence of gout compared with men. Consuming alcoholic drinks (particularly beer), meat (especially red meat), some seafood (e.g., shellfish, some large saltwater fish), fruit juice, and beverages sweetened with high-fructose corn syrup increases the risk of gout. Purine-rich foods such as nuts, oatmeal, asparagus, legumes, and mushrooms do not seem to increase the risk.

How will the Gout manifest?

Gout is typically diagnosed clinically based on the rapid development of monoarticular arthritis marked by swelling and redness usually involving the first metatarsophalangeal joint.

Prevention of Gout:

In mild to moderate cases of gout, lifestyle changes can decrease uric acid levels in the blood.

- Food Habits- Appropriate diet is very important. Overweight is a big factor causing joint pain Food that can be included and avoided in patients with gouty arthritis is given in the table below.
- Sleep Apnea- control of sleep apnea may help in the control of gout.
- Dehydration-Becoming dehydrated may also be a reason for gout risk. Consuming an adequate amount of water is advisable.
- Drinking soda- Carbonated water for drinks or drinking soda has a high-fructose corn syrup which is a culprit in elevating uric acid levels, thereby increasing gout risk.
- Kidney stones- kidney stones may get traces of uric acid. To prevent dehydration, drinking a sufficient amount of water a day is very essential.
- Poorly fitting shoes- Wearing the wrong shoes can become another gout-triggering factor.

Dietary management of Gout:

Medical Management of Gout:

Many drug substances are available for the treatment of hyperuricemia. As a first-line therapy along with these drugs, a compound is to be recommended which can cause symptomatic relief. One of the best choices is an anti-inflammatory agent. The medications used for acute Gout attack are NSAIDs (Indomethacin), Colchicine, Corticosteroids. In case of chronic Gouty arthritis drugs recommended for reducing hyperuricemia are allopurinol, febuxostat, probenecid, pegloticase, lesinurad, etc.




Women's Day Celebration-UHTC:

Health education sessions were conducted during OP timings, a whole day for women and their families, and queries regarding vaginal hygiene, pap smear, iron supplementation in anemia, and blood transfusion in severe anemia were cleared.





World Oral Health Day Programme







Biosafety in Health care and Research

The Department of Microbiology, CHRI, organized a Guest Lecture on 03.03.2021, titled "Biosafety in Health Care and Research". The resource person was Prof. Dr. J. Jayalakshmi, Professor and Head, Department of Microbiology, KMCH, Coimbatore. The speaker gave a detailed view on how safe handling of infectious materials in microbiological laboratories, biomedical research facilities, teaching and training laboratories, and healthcare facilities can be accomplished through the application of containment principles, risk assessment, and risk control. She also highlighted the hazardous procedures leading to infection in laboratories, the risk group organisms, Biosafety levels, Type of BSC's, code of practice, and also the proper use of PPE. A total of 40 participants- faculty, postgraduates, and research scholars participated in the lecture.









Road Safety Day - 2021

Department of Microbiology, CHRI organized and conducted a Road Safety Awareness program, to commemorate National Safety Day-2021 on 04.03.2021. 




WOMEN'S DAY Celebration- Department of OBG, CHRI








A Huge Retrosternal Mass in Mediastinum

A 40 year old female presented to the Department of General Surgery, CHRI with complaints of swelling in the neck since 2 months associated with breathlessness, difficulty in swallowing both solids and liquids, palpitations for the past 2 months. On evaluation, CT NECK showed-large mass behind the sternum in the region of mediastinum of size 49*68*85 mm arising from the left lobe of thyroid causing significant tracheal shift and luminal narrowing and displacing the major blood vessels from the heart, to the right side. The surgical team comprising of Dr. Sanjay Theodore, Department of Cardiothoracic and vascular surgery, with Dr.Ananthramakrishnan and Dr. Senthil Kumar from the Department of General Surgery, and Anaesthesia team comprising of Dr. Ravindran, Dr. Balamurugan and Dr. Merlin, Chettinad Hospital and Research Institute, operated on the patient on 9/3/2021. Sternotomy was done, and a huge vascular mass was found in the superior mediastinum attached to the left lobe of thyroid. The mediastinal mass was successfully removed along with the thyroid gland. Patient recovered symptomatically and her breathing difficulty as well as swallowing difficulty improved drastically after the surgery. Patient is recuperating well in the ward at present. CARE congratulates the team of surgeons and anaesthetists for operating on this challenging and rare case.








CHET-PEDICON-2021











Posterior Tibial Tendon Insufficiency – An Overview








Overview of Leukemia- A Pathologist Perspective






Cardiac Biomarkers

The Department of Radiology, Chettinad Hospital, and Research Institute organized a guest lecture on the topic 'Role of PET CT In Pyrexia of Unknown Origin' on 17.03.2021. The speaker of the event was Dr. L.Muralikrishna, Lead Consultant, Fortis-Vadapalani. Excerpts from the lecture: Pyrexia of Unknown Origin (PUO) is defined as fever above 38.5°C lasting for 3 weeks, of which at least 1 week has been spent in a complete and comprehensive investigation without a





conclusive cause. Bacterial infections, human immunodeficiency virus, hidden malignancy, sarcoidosis, and autoimmune disorders are some other important causes of PUO. Typical radiologic investigations include chest radiography, computed tomography, and magnetic resonance imaging. An atlas of cases where these investigations had been inconclusive but fluorine-18 fluorodeoxyglucose positron emission tomography demonstrated the site of pathology and directed histologic diagnosis were discussed. A total of 60 participants attended the guest lecture.

Health Education - Gynaecological Problems of Young Women.

A Health Education campaign has been organized by the Department of Obstetrics & Gynecology in collaboration with the Chettinad School of Law, CARE on 17.03.2021 for the female students of Law school. 







Seminar on Critical Importance of Research Exposure of the Medical Students for the Development of Best Clinical Mind










Transcranial Direct Current Stimulation in Psychiatry








Weekly CME - Fungal Sinusitis.






CHETPULMOCON - Recent Advances in Respiratory Medicine

Rare presentation of very huge fibroid uterus - successfully managed

45 years old, woman, Para 2 live 2 presented to OPD of Obstetrics &Gynecology with severe anemia and swelling of the abdomen. The evaluation revealed a Hb of 4.7 gms% and a swelling occupying the entire abdomen equivalent to a 9 months pregnant uterus. CT scan showed the mass arising from the uterus, most probably a mammoth fibroid with early degenerative changes. Relevant investigations were done, 3 units of Pack cell transfusion was given and Hb rose to 9.9 gms, subsequently the surgery was scheduled on 25.03.2021. Combined epidural and general anesthesia were given. Findings after opening the abdomen were huge fibroid of 30cm* 25cms occupying the whole abdominal cavity.






Total abdominal hysterectomy with removal of both ovaries was done. The anticipated intraoperative blood loss which was about 500- 600 ml, was managed with two units of pack cell transfusion intraoperatively. The weight of the tumor was 5.88 kg. Removal of the huge mammoth tumor was carried out without any complications such as injury to ureters due to altered anatomical course and excess blood loss during surgery. Urine output was clear and adequate throughout surgery and also during the post-operative period. The patient is now recovering faster in the post-operative ward.

Futuristic Research in Nanotechnology

The Faculty of Allied Health Sciences, CARE organized a one-day International Conference on 'Futuristic Research in Nanotechnology' on 25.03. 2021. The main aim of the conference was to provide a platform for sharing valuable ideas in the field of Nanotechnology among scientists, academicians, researchers, and students around the world. A total number of 484 participants registered for the conference among which 24 participants were from countries such as South Africa, South Korea, Sweden, Turkey, and Taiwan. Three scientific sessions were held with eminent speakers from renowned international and national institutes. Dr. PS Vijayakumar, Scientist and AcSIR-Assistant Profes-

His speech was on designing nanoparticles suitable for the targeted delivery of chemotherapeutic drugs to cancer cells. His lecture was about the bioinspired and biomimetic synthesis of nanomaterials for anti-biofouling and antibacterial activity. The Keynote address of the conference was given by Dr. Aravind Vijayaraghavan, Reader-Nanomaterials, Department of Materials, National Graphene Institute, The University of Manchester, United Kingdom. He spoke about the use of graphene-based nanomaterials in the field of medicine. His lecture highlighted the salient features of graphene in fabricating ultra-sensitive immunoassay biosensors. Following which oral and e-poster presentations were conducted. Presentations were judged and best presentation awards were given. The conference served as an opportunity for young minds to acquire knowledge about nanomaterials and their nanocomposites used in medicine and agriculture.




Biochemical Investigations- Diagnosis and Monitoring of Diabetes Mellitus








Endoscopic Ear Surgery


